

**TOWN OF SAINT ANDREWS**  
**Regular Council Meeting**  
**Minutes**  
**April 4, 2016**

A Regular meeting of Town Council was held in the Council Chambers at the W. C. O'Neill Arena Theatre beginning at 7:00 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor Choptiany, Deputy Mayor Catherine Akagi, Councillors Edie Bishop, Lee Sochasky, Doug Naish, Guy Groulx and Patrick Mann. Also present were Staff Members: Jamie Carr, CAO/Clerk, Chris Spear, Treasurer/Deputy Clerk, Hap Stelling, Manager of Planning & Development and Gail McLaughlin, Administrative Assistant.

**DISCLOSURE OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST IF ANY-**

Councillor Naish declared a Conflict of Interest citing personal reasons, to item FA160301 Council's consideration to appoint Ryan Wood to the St. Andrews Wharf Board.

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

It was moved by Councillor Mann, seconded by Deputy Mayor Akagi and carried to amend the Agenda by moving item E1 Police Report to the position before C1 Presentations.

**STAFF REPORTS:** As per Amended Agenda

As noted by the Amended Agenda, Cpl. Jayson Hansen provided the Police Report to Council at this time.

**PRESENTATIONS**

At 7:10, Lori MacKenzie, Public Health Dietitian from Horizon Health Network gave a presentation on the importance of providing a supportive environment for mothers to breastfeed their children.

It was moved by Councillor Sochasky, seconded by Councillor Bishop and carried that Council be supportive of employees and others in the community who choose to breastfeed. The following pledge was read by the Mayor.

**Breastfeeding Friendly Community Pledge**

The Town of Saint Andrews will create a supportive environment for our employees and others in our community who choose to breastfeed by:

- Informing all staff that the right to breastfeed anywhere anytime is protected by the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms.
- Openly showing support by displaying the Breastfeeding Friendly sign in our buildings and posting our pledge and signs on our town website.
- Providing a place for a mother to breastfeed discretely if requested.
- Defending a mother's right to breastfeed in public if she is criticized for doing so.
- Offering employees sufficient break time to either feed their infant or pump milk.

At 7:20, Kurt Gumushel gave a presentation on Active Transportation relating to bike trails within the Town and encouraging the use of them by locals as well as visitors.

**MINUTES**

It was moved by Councillor Sochasky, seconded by Councillor Mann, and carried to adopt the minutes of the Regular Meeting of Council held on March 7, 2016 at 7 PM.

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Akagi, seconded by Councillor Bishop and carried to adopt the minutes of the Special Meeting of Council held on March 29, 2016 at 7PM.

**STAFF REPORTS**

It was moved by Councillor Sochasky, seconded by Deputy Mayor Akagi and carried to accept the Staff Reports as presented.

## COMMUNICATIONS

Mayor Choptiany read correspondence from Jennifer Whitehead of the Nurses Association of New Brunswick asking Council to recognize National Nursing Week May 9-15, 2016.

## COMMITTEE REPORTS & RESOLUTIONS

### Business, Recreation and Special Events Committee

It was moved by Councillor Sochasky, seconded by Deputy Mayor Akagi and carried that Council approve the use of the Arena Curling area for the Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corp 352 Fundy Annual review as requested, with the expenses to be covered by Assistance Grant or Civic Promotion funds.

### Finance and Administration Committee

It was moved by Councillor Groulx, seconded by Deputy Mayor Akagi and carried that Council reappoint Bob Wallace, David Johnson and Eric Raab to the St. Andrews Tree Committee each for three year terms, ending June 2019.

At this point, Councillor Naish left the Theatre as he declared a Conflict of Interest on the next item on the Agenda.

It was moved by Councillor Groulx, seconded by Councillor Sochasky and carried that Council approve appoint Ryan Wood as a member-at-large to the St. Andrews Wharf Board for a one (1) year term.

At this point, Councillor Naish returned to his seat at the Council Table.

It was moved by Councillor Groulx, seconded by Deputy Mayor Akagi and carried that Council approve the use of Town property in front of Lumberjacks at 213 Water Street with the condition that the request be sent to the Planning Advisory Committee for consideration of the proposed setting up of bistro tables for the service of food on Town property.

It was moved by Councillor Groulx, seconded by Deputy Mayor Akagi and carried that Council reappoint Jill Stewart and Jeff Cross to the Planning Advisory Committee each for a three year term.

It was moved by Councillor Naish, seconded by Councillor Sochasky and carried that Council approve a \$500 Assistance Grant to Voices of the Bay as requested.

It was moved by Councillor Naish, seconded by Councillor Groulx and carried that Council approve the renewal of the lease between the Town of Saint Andrews and the St. Andrews Yacht Club for an additional three (3) year term or period ending May 2019.

It was moved by Councillor Naish, seconded by Councillor Sochasky and carried that the Town of Saint Andrews amend the motion from March 7, 2016, Council meeting, as follows:

**Be it Resolved** that the Municipality of the Town of Saint Andrews submit to the Municipal Capital Borrowing Board an application for the authorization to borrow \$1,205,000 for capital expenses for the following terms and amounts:

Councillor Bishop and Councillor Groulx registered Nay votes.

It was moved by Councillor Naish, seconded by Councillor Sochasky and carried that leave be granted to introduce By-Law No 16-02, A By-Law of the Town of Saint Andrews Respecting Conservation Heritage and that it be read by title a first time.

### Schedule "A"

TOWN OF SAINT ANDREWS

BYLAW NO. 16-02

### HERITAGE CONSERVATION BYLAW

The Council of the Town of Saint Andrews, under the authority vested in it by the *Heritage Conservation Act*, Chapter H-4.05, Statutes of New Brunswick 2010, enacts as follows:

#### **1. PURPOSES**

The purposes of this bylaw are to:

- 1) Promote the longterm economic, cultural and social development of the Town of Saint Andrews by conserving the distinctive heritage buildings and streetscapes that maintain the Town's international recognition.
- 2) Support the significance of the Saint Andrews Town Plat as one of Canada's largest Historic District National Historic Sites.
- 3) Maintain the visual character of the Town's heritage buildings, streetscapes and green spaces while supporting its growth as a progressive community.

#### **2. INTERPRETATION**

"Act" means the *Heritage Conservation Act*, S.N.B. 2010, Chapter H-4.05.

"Board" means the Heritage Board of the Town of Saint Andrews appointed pursuant to the Act.

"Character defining elements" means the features, materials, and location of a structure or property that exemplify its historic architectural or visual form, time period and/or heritage value.

"Council" means the municipal Council of the Town of Saint Andrews, New Brunswick.

"Development" means development as defined in the *Community Planning Act*, R.S.N.B. 1973, Chapter C-12.

"Heritage Officer" means a heritage officer appointed under Section 54 of the *Act*, or his or her designate.

"Heritage Permit" means a heritage permit pursuant to the Act.

"Heritage value" means the visual, historic, natural, cultural or social importance or significance for past, present and future generations. In the Town of Saint Andrews, this is most often represented by physical *character defining elements* and its contribution to the Town's historic character.

"Structure" means anything constructed or erected on or below the ground or attached to something on the ground, and includes all buildings.

#### **3. HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREAS AND BYLAW APPLICATION**

1) In accordance with Section 55(2) of the Act, the *Council* establishes the original Town Plat, as shown in Schedule C, as the Town Plat Heritage Conservation Area. The Council also establishes the Historic Business District, as shown in Schedule C, as a portion of this Area where additional heritage provisions apply.

2) The *Council* also establishes as Individual Heritage Conservation Areas the properties listed in Schedule B, and shown in Schedule C, which lie within the municipality but are outside the Town Plat.

3) This bylaw shall apply to the Conservation Areas established above.

#### **4. ADMINISTRATION**

In order to ensure consistent policies for conserving the architectural, historical and visual heritage of the Town of Saint Andrews, the *Board* shall:

1) Administer this bylaw in accordance with the Act.

2) Undertake additional heritage responsibilities that are assigned by the *Council*.

3) Adopt design guidelines that provide direction to the public on the design principles and standards for the Heritage Conservation Areas and to the *Board* in assessing applications for a *Heritage Permit*.

4) Establish and maintain an inventory of the *structures* on properties designated for heritage conservation under this bylaw. This inventory shall include photographs, *character defining elements*, *heritage value* and other information relevant to the architectural and other features to be conserved.

5) Take reasonable effort to make the owners of these properties aware of the *character defining elements* and *heritage value* of their properties and *structures*, and make advice available on the conservation of these elements.

## **5. HERITAGE PERMIT**

1) No development specified in this bylaw shall be carried out, whether or not any other municipal permit is issued, until a *Heritage Permit* has been issued by the *Board*.

2) Applications for a *Heritage Permit* shall be submitted on the form prescribed by the *Board*. The *Board* will only consider applications that provide all required information, or subsequently requested information, needed to support its decision-making.

3) A *Heritage Officer* may issue a *Heritage Permit* where he or she is satisfied that the application is complete and complies with the design guidelines for proposals relating to:

- a) Replacement of windows, doors, exterior siding and roofing,
- b) Replacement of steps and porches,
- c) Sheds and garages, and
- d) Signs

4) Where a *Heritage Officer* is not satisfied that an application is complete and complies with the design guidelines, or may warrant more detailed review or potential terms or conditions, he or she shall automatically refer the application to the *Board*.

## **6. TOWN PLAT HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREA**

### **1) General Provisions**

a) A new development on properties that are not listed in Schedule A may be traditional or contemporary but shall be of a design and siting that is visually compatible with surrounding heritage properties, streetscapes and patterns of open space.

b) Signs shall be of a heritage style, including materials, colours, typefaces and placement.

### **2) Schedule A properties**

Properties within the Town Plat that are listed in Schedule A are recognized to have significant historical or architectural values that are to be conserved while supporting their contemporary use.

a) A development to the exterior of an existing structure that will be visible from a street or principal driveway shall conserve its *character defining elements* and complement its primary historic architectural form.

b) A new development, including an accessory structure, that will be visible from a street or principal driveway shall be of a design and siting that is compatible with the property's *character defining elements* and historic visual character.

### **3) Historic Business District**

The Town of Saint Andrews has recognized the significance of the historical and architectural streetscape of its Historic Business District that, as a whole, is to be conserved to a higher extent.

a) A development to the exterior of an existing structure shall be consistent with its historic design and architecture and shall use building materials and façade treatments that are consistent with the materials historically used on that structure.

b) Any new development shall be designed and constructed to be consistent with the historic design and architecture of existing heritage structures within the Historic Business District. Exterior building materials shall reflect the traditional architecture, design and appearance of the Historic Business District, as outlined in the St. Andrews Heritage Handbook prepared by the St. Andrews Civic Trust.

## **7. INDIVIDUAL HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREAS**

Properties listed in Schedule B as individual Heritage Conservation Areas lie within the municipality but outside the Town Plat, and are recognized to have significant historical or architectural values that are to be conserved while supporting their contemporary use.

1) A development to the exterior of an existing structure that will be visible from a street or principal driveway shall conserve its *character defining elements* and complement its primary historic architectural form.

2) A new development, including an accessory structure that will be visible from a street or principal driveway shall be of a design and siting that is compatible with the property's *character defining elements* and historic visual character.

## **8. MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR: SCHEDULE A AND B PROPERTIES**

1) For structures located on properties listed in Schedule A or Schedule B of this bylaw, no *Heritage Permit* is required for ordinary maintenance, minor repairs or the replacement of damaged or deteriorated materials where these use visually-compatible materials and maintain the same appearance as the original. This does not include an alteration, replacement or other action that involves a change in design or outward appearance. Compliance with this section is to be determined by the *Heritage Officer* or the *Board*.

2) The use of heritage colours on the exterior of a structure is encouraged. The use of fluorescent colours is prohibited.

## **9. DEMOLITION, REMOVAL OR RELOCATION: SCHEDULE A AND B PROPERTIES**

1) Any structure on a property listed in Schedule A or Schedule B of this bylaw shall not be demolished, removed or relocated without a *Heritage Permit*.

2) No permit for the demolition of a structure shall be issued unless:

- a) The *Board* has determined that the structure does not contribute to the *heritage value* of the property, or
- b) The structure has been offered for sale and relocation, at or below a fair market value, for a minimum of six consecutive months and no sale contract has been made. The terms and conditions for the offer and advertising of such a sale shall be determined by the *Board*; and
- c) Failing such sale, a plan is filed and approved by the *Board* that provides for the salvage of architectural details from the structure prior to its demolition; and
- d) A plan for site redevelopment is filed and approved by the *Board* that commits to future uses and structures that will continue to support the property's heritage value.

3) Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect the demolition of any structure that the *Council* has found, under the bylaw entitled "Respecting Dangerous or Unsightly Premises", to be dangerous.

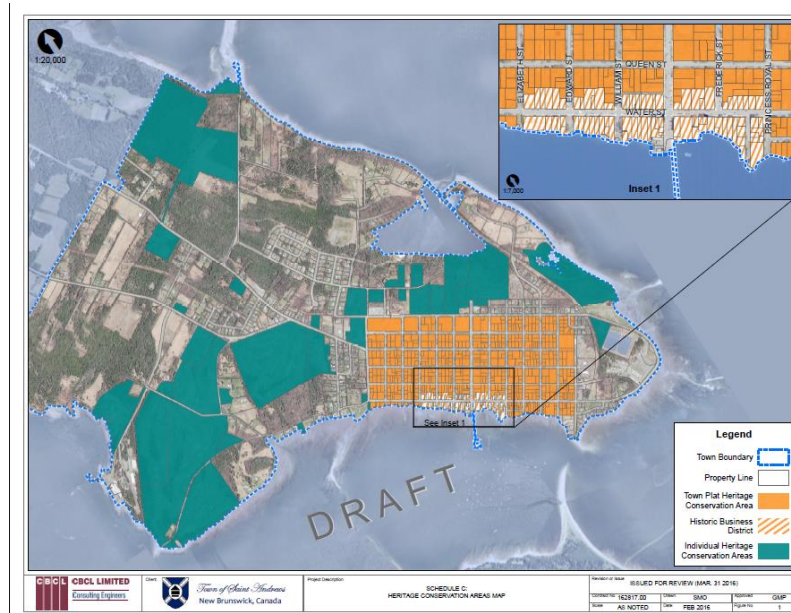
