

BY-LAW NO. 94-2
A By-Law to Regulate Vehicular Traffic
in the Town of St. Andrews

BE IT ENACTED by the Council of the Town of St. Andrews as follows:

1. In this by-law

- 1) The words defined in the Motor Vehicle Act of the Province of New Brunswick and amendments thereto, when used in this by-law shall have the same meaning as in the said Act.
- 2) "BUS STOP" means a street or portion of a street set aside for the exclusive parking of buses for the purpose of allowing passengers to enter or alight there-from.
- 3) "CHIEF OF POLICE" means the senior Royal Canadian Mounted Police member, assigned to the Town of St. Andrews by the divisional headquarters, under an agreement between the federal government and the town for the policing of the Town of St. Andrews. In the event the said agreement is terminated, the chief of police shall mean the senior police officer appointed by the Town Council.
- 4) "COUNCIL" means the Town Council of the Town of St. Andrews.
- 5) "CURB" means the lateral limit of the portion of the street used or intended to be used for vehicles, whether or not marked by curbstones.
- 6) "LOADING ZONE" means a street or portion of a street set aside for the exclusive parking of commercial vehicles for the purpose of loading and unloading merchandise.
- 7) "POLICE FORCE" means the officers engaged or appointed by the Council for the purpose of keeping the peace.
- 8) "STREET" means the entire width between the boundary lines of every public street, road, highway, lane, alley, square, Town-owned lot of land, park, all parking lots, school entrances and exits or place when any part thereof is used by the general public for the passage of vehicles and includes bridges thereon.
- 9) "THROUGH STREET" shall have the same meaning as Through Highway.
- 10) "TOWN" means the Town of St. Andrews.

2. SCHEDULES AMENDMENTS

Subject to obtaining the sanctions of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council when the By-Law relates to a portion of a provincial highway, the Council may from time to time amend by Schedules "A" to "I" inclusive of this by-law.

3. AUTHORITY OF POLICE

- 1) It shall be the duty of all members of the police force to enforce all traffic by-laws of the Town and the Motor Vehicle Act of the Province of New Brunswick.

- 2) The police force is authorized in case of any accident, emergency or parade, to re-route traffic and to prohibit the movement of traffic on any street in the Town.

4. AUTHORITY TO MOVE VEHICLES

- 1) It shall be lawful for any member of the police force to move or cause to be moved any vehicle found stopped or parked in violation of the provisions of this by-law, on any street in the Town.
- 2) A vehicle so moved under this by-law shall be stored in such place as the chief of police may decide upon, and the registered owner of such vehicle at the time shall be liable for costs and charges for the storage and moving thereof.
- 3) There will be no liability attached to the Town or a member of the police force for any damages to a vehicle moved or taken into custody under this section.

5. (1) Subject to obtaining the sanctions of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council when the By-Law relates to a portion of a provincial highway, the Council may from time to time designate by amendment of this By-Law

- (a) the time and mode of parking on any street,
- (b) the direction of traffic on one-way streets,
- (c) the loading and unloading zones,
- (d) the prohibition of parking on any street, or portion thereof, and
- (e) order the placing and maintaining of traffic control devices, as deemed necessary to regulate, warn or guide traffic.

6. ANGLE AND PARALLEL PARKING

- 1) Where angle parking is permitted, a vehicle shall be parked at an angle of 45 degrees to the curb or boundary of such street, so that the front of the vehicle is nearest to the curb or boundary of the street.
- 2) When angle or parallel parking spaces are indicated by suitable markings, no vehicle shall be stopped except within the marked limits of a parking space.
- 3) This section is subject to subsection 194(4) of the Motor Vehicle Act.

7. BUS STOPS & PARKING

The streets designated in Schedule "A" are set aside for the exclusive parking of buses for the purpose of allowing passengers to enter or alight there-from and no person shall park a vehicle between the limits of said streets. Buses may stop anywhere momentarily for the purpose of embarkment and disembarkment.

8. NO PARKING ANYTIME

No person shall park a vehicle on the side and between the limits of the streets designated in Schedule "B".

9. ONE-WAY STREETS

Streets set out in Schedule "C" of this by-law are designated as one-way streets and the driver of a vehicle driving on any of the said streets shall only proceed in the direction specified for the particular street by the said by-law.

10. SPEED LIMITS

No person shall drive a vehicle in excess of twenty (20) kilometers per hour on the Government of Canada wharf.

11. SNOW REMOVAL

1) During the period from the 15th day of November in any year to the 31st day of March in the following year, no person shall park any vehicle on any street between the hours of 2:00 o'clock and 7:00 o'clock in the forenoon.

2) Unless otherwise directed by a Town official, parking on the east side of William Street from Water Street to the water is exempted from Article 11, paragraph (1) of this by-law.

12. PEDESTRIAN CROSSWALKS

Pedestrian crosswalks shall be in accordance with Schedule "D"

13. TRAFFIC SIGNALS

Traffic signals shall be in accordance with Schedule "E".

14. PARKING FOR THE DISABLED

Parking for the disabled shall be accordance with Schedule "G".

15. LIMITED PARKING

Limited parking shall be in accordance with Schedule "H".

16. STOP & YIELD SIGNS

Stop & yield signs shall be in accordance with Schedule "I".

17. No person shall overhaul or repair a motor vehicle or trailer on any public street or square.

18. (1) For the purposes of this by-law, no person shall ride upon, operate or use a sled or toboggan on a sidewalk or street other than pulled by a person.

(2) For purposes of this by-law, the use of roller blades, skateboards, coasters or toy vehicles are regulated, with respect to movement, in the same manner as the Motor Vehicle Act, Chapter M-17, Statutes of New Brunswick, regulates the movement of bicycles.

19. (1) Notwithstanding this section, the chief of police, any member of the police force or the town clerk may, either before or after the institution of proceedings against a person for any violation under this by-law, accept from the person alleged to have been guilty of such violation, the payment of a sum

- (a) equal to the minimum fine prescribed for such violation for a first offence,
- (b) equal to twice the minimum fine prescribed for such violation for a second offence,
- (c) equal to the maximum penalty prescribed for such violation for a third or subsequent offence,

and shall forthwith forward a report to the Registrar of Motor Vehicles like that required under the Motor Vehicle Act from a judge making a conviction.

- (2) Subject to being liable for the points required to be assessed against the record of a driver for a conviction, a payment made under subsection (1) shall constitute a full satisfaction, release and discharge of all penalties and imprisonments incurred by such person for such violation.

20. No parade shall be held in the Town without first obtaining permission in writing from the Town of St. Andrews.

21. PENALTIES

- 1) Any person who violates any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and liable on Provincial Offence Procedures Act to the following penalties:

- (a) for a violation of sections 18, 19, 20 and 21, a penalty of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and not more than fifty dollars (\$50)

- (b) for a violation of any other section, to a penalty of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00).

- 2) Should any person convicted of a violation of any provision of this by-law default in payment of the fine ordered by the convicting judge, then the payment of said fine may be enforced pursuant to the provisions of the Provincial Offences Procedures Act, Statutes of New Brunswick.

22. BY-LAW REPEALED

The Town of St. Andrews By-Law to Regulate Vehicular Traffic in the Town of St. Andrews passed on the 3rd day of October, A.D. 1988 and all amendments thereto are repealed on the coming into force of this by-law.



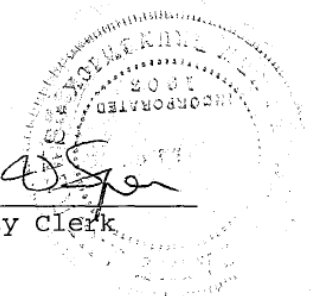
