FALL YARD WASTE CLEAN-UP



Daily curbside pickup began **September 24**. Branches bundled 2ft x 3ft not to exceed 50 lbs. **Loose** brush and tree branches may be brought to the designated chipping area in the Town Public Works Yard during working hours. Please ensure that all material is free of rope, wire, etc. Bags will be available at the Town Office at **\$3.00** per bundle of 10 as of **September 17**. This service will end on **Friday, November 9** and is not available to large scale or commercial contractors.

REGULAR GARBAGE & CURBSIDE RECYCLING PICK-UP



Within Saint Andrews, residential garbage is picked up 3 consecutive weeks with recycle blue carts being picked up the 4th week. Garbage containers and Blue Carts must **not** be placed outside for collection earlier than **8:00 pm Wednesday night** and removed not later than **7:00 am on Thursday morning** (*the day of the collection*). Please use proper containers to prevent an unsightly appearance, pest infestation, or accessible to dogs or other animals. The Town's garbage contractor picks up residential garbage only. Business, commercial, industrial, institutional or government establishments must arrange for private collection.

REGISTER YOUR DOG – GET A FREE TIC REMOVER

ALL dogs living within the Town of Saint Andrews are required to be licensed by January 31 each year. Please bring **proof of rabies** inoculations to the Town Hall when purchasing your dog's tags. **ALL** dogs **MUST** be on leash and/or under the control of the owner or custodian at all times. The By-law directs you to scoop up after your pet as well. **Tags for 2019** will be ready for purchase on **November 1, 2018**. *Tick removal kits* are available in *limited quantity* at the Town Hall for those registering their dogs early.

AFTER HOURS & EMERGENCIES RESPONSE, 529-5120

Call 529-5120 to report after-hours emergencies such as: water leaks, fallen trees, street safety issues, flooding of storm water ditches or other safety concerns. An on-call municipal employee will be dispatched to assess the matter. If a situation can wait for regular business hours, please contact the Town Hall 8:30 a.m. to 4:30p.m. Monday-Friday (excluding holidays).

REMINDER WINTER PARKING - BY-LAW 94-2

No overnight parking on any streets beginning **November 15** to **March 31** from **2a.m. to 7a.m.** Unless otherwise directed by a Town official, parking on the east side of William Street from Water Street to the water is exempted from Article 11, paragraph (1) of this By-law.






SAINT ANDREWS FIRE DEPARTMENT

The St. Andrews Fire Department reminds everyone to have their chimneys swept and inspected by a certified technician. Also remember burning yard waste or leaves in town is prohibited. For more information on the Town's burning Bylaw, please contact the Fire Hall at 529-5150. Remember, when you change your clocks this fall, also replace the batteries in your smoke and CO2 detectors. This can save your life! Thirty seconds of fire prevention could make all the difference in the world. If your civic numbers are missing or covered over with bushes and vines, it is very important to install them and/or ensure they are visible to help First Responders find you during an emergency. **Every Second Counts!** Have a fire safe fall!

WHAT IS SENTINEL?

Stay informed about Town emergencies such as power outages, boil water orders, street closures, flooding and downed trees.

Sign up for messages through voicemail, email, or text. Three ways to sign up:

SAINT ANDREWS NUISANCE DEER MANAGEMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (NDMAP)

What? The NDMAP allows private landowners to authorize hunters to harvest ONE antlerless deer on their property. Permits are for antlerless deer, which have the greatest effect on controlling local populations. This is the third year for the program in Saint Andrews.

When? Permits will be valid during the legal deer hunting season (Oct.01 – Nov.17, 2018). Application dates are Sept.04 to Oct. 31, 2018.

How? Property owners must contact the Town office, where Staff will verify the Property Identification Numbers (PIDs) are required to apply and will be submitted to ERD for assessment.

Private properties greater than 1 acre with potential for NDMAP permits may receive a site visit by ERD staff to assess for potential safety concerns.

Hunting will NOT be allowed within 100 meters of neighboring houses.

Bow hunters must register with the ERD office in St. George for a deer hunting license. Only one antlerless deer may be harvested per hunter, in addition to the normal one-deer bag limit for the regular NB Deer Hunt season. Property owners must approve who is permitted to hunt on their land.



SAINT ANDREWS RCMP

Criminal Record (CR) checks can be processed at the St. Stephen or St. George office. The Saint Andrews office can provide the CR application forms only. There is no fee for local-residents. Anyone who requires fingerprints for court or for Criminal Record/Vulnerable Sector checks must go St. George for Livescan digital fingerprinting. An RCMP member can be reached at any time of the day – you do not have to wait to physically see one at the office. We do not have administrative staff at the Saint Andrews office and members are expected to be out on proactive work and attending service calls. The 24-hour Non-emergency line is 1-888-506-7267 (English) or 1-888-506-1472 (French). Dial 9-1-1 for emergencies or use the telephone located at the Saint Andrews Office front step in the yellow phone box. Our radio transmission can no longer be picked up by scanner. Not reporting a crime for fear of “scanner land” is a thing of the past.

Feature legislation: If a police officer is of the opinion that a driver is unfit to drive a motor vehicle safely for a medical or other reason, the police officer may request the driver to surrender his or her licence and suspend his or her driving privilege. 24hr suspension – **no fine**. Impaired driving is the leading criminal cause of death in Canada killing on average 4 Canadians each day.

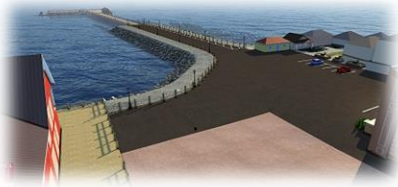

Protecting Market Square & Market Wharf for the Future



According to Town records, the Saint Andrews Market Square was first constructed in the 1800's as a centre of commerce, assembly, and conversation. The older section of the current Market Wharf (closest to the shore) was

constructed in 1956. Fast forward many decades and a few developments later, to the dilemma facing Council today... how to protect these valuable Town assets from mounting structural vulnerabilities and the effects of climate change, while still respecting the heritage and traditions that have helped shape how these spaces have been used and who we are as a seaside community.

At first glance, these assets may appear to be in great shape. Indeed, they were built solidly and have served the Town well for several decades. Unfortunately, though a close look reveals serious deterioration which must be addressed very soon if they are to be protected for future generations. Wooden cribwork, retaining walls, and decking have settled and rotted under the Square and several surface areas are sinking due to the movement of fines beneath the surface. At the Wharf, some of the cross bracing, decking, and fender piles have rotted and ballast boxes and trestle posts are broken and worn. The decay and settlement of the wood is now resulting in cracking and settling and spalling of the concrete decking above. Normal tidal action, combined with the anticipated effects of sea level rise and storm surges, are expected to accelerate the rate of deterioration at both sites over the next couple of years.

The Town's engineering consultant, CBCL Ltd. has developed concept drawings and cost estimates for Council's consideration to protect the area. The design would see the Square extended slightly further out into the Bay, but protected by armour stone, and the stone extending to connect to/ line both sides of the older section of Market Wharf. Not surprisingly, the work comes with a hefty price-tag of approx. \$3.3 million, which cannot be borne by the Town without funding support from the other two levels of government. The concept was revealed at a recent Public Open House and can be viewed on the Town's HomePage.

Saint Andrews will be a dynamic community for residents of all ages and backgrounds: a centre of education and science, a leading year-round destination, and a vibrant home for arts and culture.

DRAFT Municipal Plan Mission:

The vision will be achieved by protecting and promoting our natural environment, our architectural heritage, and our recreational, cultural, and economic assets.

Initial public consultation has made it clear which areas residents believe need to be addressed within the updated plan:

The Economy, Housing, Environment, Heritage, Arts/Culture

It's not too late to contribute! More consultation and background studies will be undertaken this fall.

1- Plan to attend the second Public Consultation Forum later this fall (Date to be finalized, dates will be posted on the Town website and Information Board).

2- Check out our community engagement website: saintandrews2020.com. There, you can view background documents and reports, use an interactive map and leave specific feedback. Potential policy directions will be posted for feedback as they are written.

3- If you know someone who has left for the winter, pass along the website information to them.

4- Participate in a focus group as they are formed.

We've already heard how much people love Saint Andrews! Residents and visitors alike have made it clear that Saint Andrews is a special place - one that, despite some challenges, has a thriving and vibrant future! By participating in this process, you are helping to shape that future.



GREETINGS FROM THE MAYOR

As the busy summer season winds down, Council and Staff are busy preparing for winter and the 2019 operating year. Your Council is considering several important files, including:

- the 2019 Operating and Capital budgets
- a possible new Medical Centre and doctor recruitment
- deer management
- protection of Market Square and Market Wharf
- options for Courthouse uses
- a new 10-year Municipal Plan
- a long-term transportation plan (including downtown parking, traffic flow, trails and active transportation, sidewalks and crosswalks, etc.)
- several by-laws and policies

One issue that is becoming clear is the need for us to do a better job of planning for long-term asset maintenance and replacement. The 2018 Capital budget was just over \$2 million, and if we were to follow our new Asset Management Plan, we would need to invest over \$3 million in 2019, another \$13 million in the four years beyond that, and well over \$16 million in the five years beyond that. This does not include the work we will need to do related to Climate Change protection. Knowing that each one cent increase in taxes only nets the Town approx. \$30,000, Council will have some very difficult decisions to make, and Staff will be working hard to find other sources of revenue.

We were very disappointed to learn recently that the Municipal By-elections, which were scheduled for December, have now been postponed until May 2019 due to the uncertainty related to the Provincial election. Unfortunately, that leaves our Council with a vacant seat for another 6 months. There are still lots of opportunities for residents to get involved in civic affairs though. Having recently passed a new Advisory Committee Policy, Council is now seeking nominations to Advisory Committees related to: Recreation, Community Growth, Arts and Culture, Age-Friendly Community, Environment, and Market Wharf. We also seek volunteer ambassadors to our Sister-City, Thorpe St. Andrews, UK. Applications can be found on the new Town website.

Council is well aware of the struggle our Town continues to face with deer population management. The authority for wildlife control rests with the Province and we have made several recommendations to them, which were based on the study conducted by UNB last year and staff research. This will be the third year for the provincially-approved nuisance bow-hunt within the Town. Interested property owners and bow hunters should contact Town Hall for more information.
