**1. Mylene Shepard, West District Planning Analyst & Acting Sergeant Jayson Hansen Presentation on the Royal Canadian Mounted Police J Division Quarterly Report**

*Acting Sergeant Jayson Hansen of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police provide Council with the RCMP - J Division Quarterly Report West District - Town of Saint Andrews from July to September 2021. In comparison over 2020, calls are slightly up for the second quarter to 169 calls for service. Top 10 occurrence calls included the Quarantine Act, false alarms, abandoned 911 calls, lost and found items, traffic speeding violations, check stops, Mental Health Act checks, suspicious person or vehicle, assault, and assistance to the general public. Break and enters are matching the same average as last year with fraud and mischief down by almost half of last year, and a reduction in intersection collisions. Five check stops were conducted with a target of completing 4 including school patrols. Our goal at minimum is 40 school patrols over the year.*

*Council thanked Sergeant Hansen for providing a review of the Quarterly Report. Council noted that the Town has received many complaints regarding speeding in the community, more than previous years. Council asked about the use of the speed tracking system and use. Sergeant Hansen noted the Town can book out the unit but also has access to the one owned by the Regional Service Commission. Council also if Town representatives can be present at the Regional Policing Meetings to have discussions on local issues. Sergeant Hansen had no issue with the request and agreed to provide information for the next meeting. Council asked for clarification of the RCMP fiscal year. The RCMP fiscal year runs from April to March, the same as the Federal Government. Council thanked Sergeant*

*Hansen for his years of service to Saint Andrews and appreciate the professionalism that is brought to the community.*


