E. PRESENTATIONS

 Lee Penney, Eastern Charlotte Waterways Presentation on the Climate Change in the Chamcook Watershed: Updated Predictions and their Implications Environmental Trust Fund Grant

Lee Penney, a representative from Eastern Charlotte Waterways provided a presentation to the Council on the Chamcook Lake Improvement Project funded through the Environmental Trust Fund of the Province of New Brunswick. The report highlighted an analysis of surface flows, assessment of water cycles, and future projections of water quality and levels as mapped out with climate change. Key findings were focused on temperature fluctuations in the waterways, levels of precipitation, and surface water flows. Council was provided with graphical visuals of the analysis completed. For surface flow, issues were found with collapsed culvers, jammed flow areas, and beaver dams. Cyanobacteria were identified and noted that as temperatures fluctuate to higher levels that there are more opportunities to see blooms in our lake systems which could be factors to watch for with water treatment.

Council thanked Mr. Penney for the presentation and asked questions associated with beaver dams and the issues regarding flow. It was noted that beaver dams are part of the issue but more of an issue is the collapsed culverts causing choke points in the system for flow. Information will be shared with the Department of Environment. Council asked about recharge rates of the water system and if there were concerns regarding groundwater with additional withdrawal from the water allocations. Mr. Penney identified that a full-scale model would need to be created to review the groundwater withdrawal and noted that the Department of Environment is working on a study of the lakes with a focus on groundwater. Council indicated they had concerns over an event that would cause problems throughout the system and that additional work should be completed to review opportunities for preventative measures as this is a critical asset for the community as the main water source.

2. Matthew Dickson and Kim Reeder, Presentation on Mind Aid Proposal of Speed-Friending Events for Saint Andrews Residents

Matthew Dickson and Kim Reeder provided a presentation to Council on the Mind Aid proposal for Speed-Friending events for Saint Andrews. The goal is to connect new residents with existing residents and help to rebuild community connections after COVID-19. They highlighted the importance of communication and in-person contact while reducing isolation. The goal is to pilot several events over the spring and summer season to help build up community connections. The first event is scheduled for Paddlefest weekend in the tent. Mind Aid put in a request for a Community Assistance Grant to help cover refreshments for the event at a request of \$150.00.

Council thanked Mr. Dickson and Ms. Reeder for their presentation and supported the grant request for the Speed-friending event. Council asked to be informed of other events so they can help participate and spread the word to the community.

Council debated the pros and cons of on sidewalk use of active transportation methods of travel in the Historic Business District. Council discussed options of piloting the use of active transportation methods for spring and fall use.
